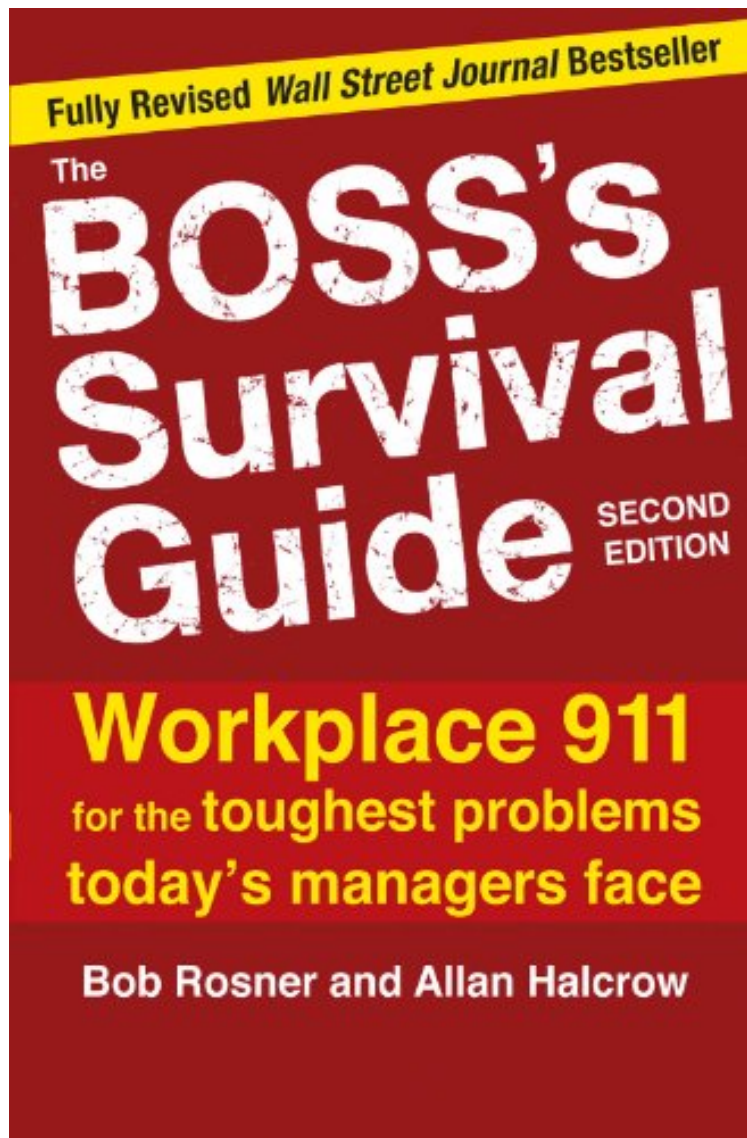

"The Boss's Survival Guide" is just about anyone who spends a large fraction of a lifetime in the workplace. First of all, it can be a reliable handbook for bosses who already are successful - the long odds are they got that way by realizing that "good" can always become "better" and they'll welcome this book for that reason.
