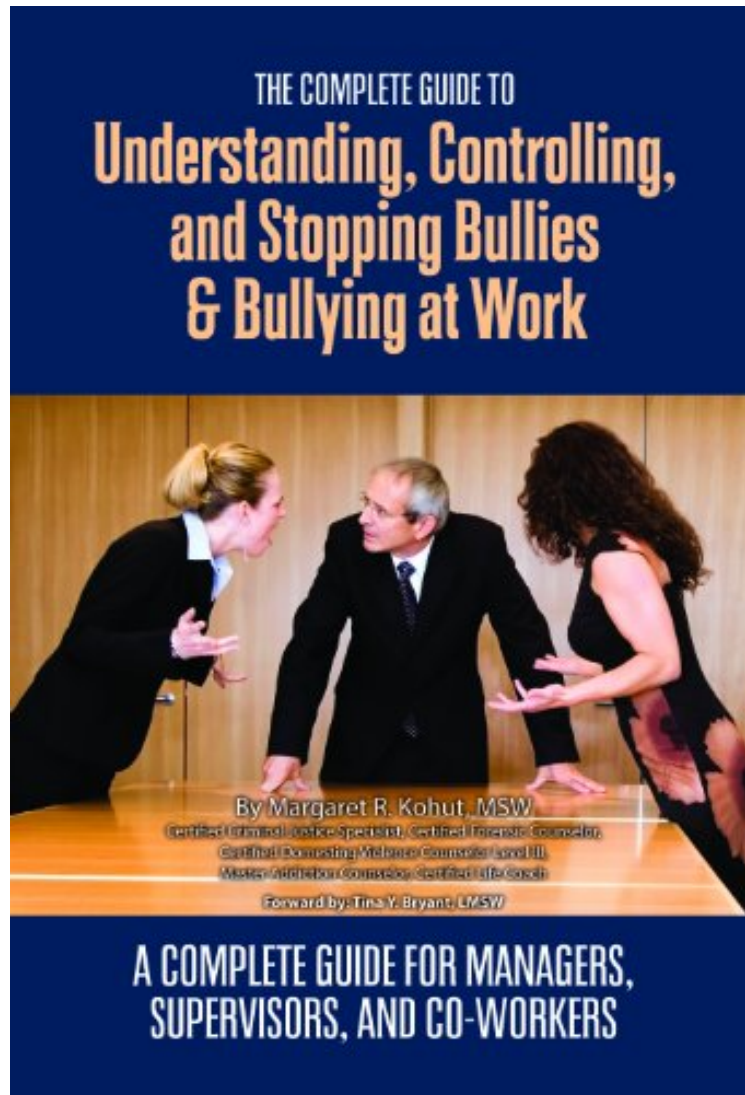

Almost 10 years after my own experience (as an older adult beginning massage therapy school; I was never bullied in the workplace in 32 years of working), the memory of that nightmare is as sharp as ever in me. In this important book, Kohut refers to Dr. Heinz Leymann's work on mobbing, and the 5 distinct stages: Conflict - Aggressive acts - Management Involvement - Branding the victim as "Difficult" or "mentally ill," and inevitably, Expulsion. I went through all of that. Since then, thanks to a loving husband and a lot of time, I have finished my MBA degree and have, on the outside at least, moved on. But just reading this book brought so much back to me that I can never forget or forgive. But if you're a manager with the power to change things, you should read this book. I will never forgive the people who left me to the mercy (not that they knew the meaning of the word) of my classmates. Except for those classmates and teachers who were kind to me, (and there were some, but like me, they had no real power) may God damn the others for what they did to me. It brings to light statistics, studies, case studies, laws and suggestions of how one should deal with the situation. It is a well written straight forward book that I would recommend to anyone. I have been researching this type of material ever since I was rocked with the realization that what was happening to me on the job as a Senior Account Manager, Top Gun in Sales, was not imaginary. It was real. It was the passage of suicidal kids who killed themselves due to bullying at school that made me ask the question "does it ever stop?" The answer based on my own experience was "no, it doesn't," and it does not matter if you are working at prestigious company like Staples Contract Inc., you are not safe from the dangers of bullying. You are not safe from harassment from weaker players who gang together (mobbing) to "take out" a strong producer in order to protect their own weak production. If the Management does not pay attention as they have failed to do at Staples, they wonder why they have such turn over, or sick days with people calling out, without resolution. I used to regularly counsel individuals who suffered under the weight of a supervisor whose "childhood issues": his/her own personal anxieties, insecurities, and other personal dynamics played out in the workplace to the detriment of their subordinates. I have listened to stories of employees being spit upon, rapped on the head (as though knocking to see if anything was inside), pushed and pulled by the hair, all from supervisors who used such tactics to try and force employees to do their bidding.. whatever that was.
